A CONTINUED LOOK INTO THE KORAN

Today is the Norse God Wodan's day. However, if you are French it is Mercury's day: Mercredi. Wodan, Thor, Mercury, Zeus, Apollo, Aphrodite, Hera, Krishna, Kali, Allah... So many, many gods have been named by various peoples since time immemorial. Good gods and bad gods, capricious gods, murderous, psychopathic gods; which certainly describes the last two gods in the list I just presented. Kali is depicted with skulls around its neck. We are apparently living in the times of Kali. Judging from the amount of death and destruction occurring at the hands of Muslims all over Europe, I would say that we are, indeed, in those terrible times of slaughter in which Kali goes berserk.

Now, lest you think just because Hindus believe in this murderous god, who is somewhat similar to aspects of Allah's character, that they are safe. Because they are a polytheistic people still in this 21st Century, Muslims will murder them too because they are not believers in: 'Had it been His will to take a son, He would have chosen whom He pleased out of His own creation. But Allah forbid! He is Allah, the One, the Almighty.' Page 273. Allah is one god not many gods.

Belief in one god makes for a more focussed philosophy. Many gods makes for confusion. Confusion makes for inefficiency. Inefficiency is imperfection. Imperfection is not the natural order of things. Hence, monotheism is the best type of belief system; however in the case of Islam, they have taken the concept to an extreme and omitted the Father/Son connection. As I have indicated before in these papers, without a relationship like that, there is no personal connection with the creator, who in the case of Islam is, Allah. This is a fundamental difference between Islam and Christianity. In Christianity God is called, Father.

Fifth paragraph on page 273: 'He created you from a single being, then from that being He created its mate. He has given you four different pairs of cattle. ¹ He molds you in your mother's womb by stages in threefold darkness.' Is it not interesting how Allah equates human beings who are, *its* with cattle? He made you and he made cattle. In the Talmud we are informed that Gentiles are, *Goyim*; 'animals in human skin'. In the Bible, the mate that was created came out of a personal being given a name; the Adama. Adam and his mate was also named and therefore a personal being called, Eve. Neither of them are called, *its*.

Here is another quote to prove that Muslims are a very paranoid bunch. "Enjoy your unbelief awhile; you shall surely be consigned to Hell. Can he who passes his night in adoration, standing or on his knees, who dreads the terrors of the life to come and hopes to earn the mercy of his Lord, be compared to the unbeliever? Are the wise and the ignorant equal? Truly, none will take heed but men of understanding.' Page 274. What a way to go through life dreading the after life and that being a condition for membership in the Muslim cult.

In case you haven't gotten it yet, 'They (*unbelievers*), shall be covered with sheets of fire from above and from beneath. By this Allah puts fear into His servant's hearts. Fear me then, My servants.' Page 274.

Let's now examine that often appearing word, *fear*. To fear your Lord is a statement we read in the Old Jewish Testament of the Bible. Some Christians will tell you that the word, *fear* means, to mind your Lord; to pay him obeisance. However, as you read the word in the Koran, it actually means to be scared to death of your Lord. In the Jewish, oily side of the Bible, the fear part was spoken of in the sense of the Koran; I mean, really, a god who wants to determine someone's faith in him by having him perform a blood sacrifice on his own son. How horrible is that? Lots of mentions of how the Jew's god helped them destroy entire nations of 'foes', just as the Koran speaks of Allah helping to squish nations like bugs. Yeah, Allah and the Jewish Yahweh are very similar conceptions of the Creator.

Compare those OT teachings and the Koran regarding their conceptions of God with the New Testament wherein Jesus is talking about a loving Father; who is kind and gentle; who asks everyone to love their neighbour just the same as one loves oneself and to be and do good in the world; indeed the call is there very clearly spoken, but so few actually get it, is to be a SON OF GOD. There are no such sentiments expressed in the Koran because Allah is alone. He has no son. Anyone disagreeing with this, '...have rightly earned Our punishment and are doomed to burn in Hell.' Page 274.

Page 275 goes on to talk about the many things Allah has done for us, such as sending the rain and bringing forth plants. "They wither, they turn yellow, and then He crumbles them to dust. Surely in this there is an admonition for men of understanding."

A little further down the same page we learn that Allah is a very practiced author. "Allah has now revealed the best of scriptures, a book uniform in style proclaiming promises and warnings. Those who fear their Lord are filled with awe as they listen to its revelations, so that their hearts soften at the remembrance of Allah. Such is Allah's guidance: He bestows it on whom He will. But he whom Allah misleads shall have none to guide him." Again we read about Allah's capricious nature. Since this theme is often repeated, it becomes hypnotic, since the book is read over and over and over by devout Muslims, deepening the paranoia as the years progress. By the time a Muslim is an adult he will have heard about Allah's capriciousness thousands of times and therefore is put in a situation of constant wondering if s/he is going to get it, so the modus becomes one of ever more extreme shows of Islamic piety because he who is the most loving of Allah, is most beloved and will gain a good cushion in Paradise. Do you now understand why there are Muslim 'extremists'? They are simply being the very best Muslims they can be getting rid of unbelievers whom Allah hates. "To the wrongdoers We shall say: "Taste the punishment which you have earned." Those who have gone before them also denied their apostles, so that Our scourge overtook them unawares. Allah disgraced them in this life, but the punishment of the life to come shall be more terrible, if they but knew it." Page 275.

Throughout the Koran, occasionally Allah pitches his book. "We have given mankind in this Koran all manner of arguments, so that they may take heed. We have revealed it in the Arabic tongue, a Koran free from faults, that they may guard themselves against evil." Page 275.

"Consider this comparison. There are two men: the one has many masters who are ever at odds among themselves; the other has one master, to whom he is devoted. Are these two to be held alike? Allah forbid! But most of them have no knowledge. You, ¹ as well as they, are doomed to die. Then, on the Day of Resurrection, you ² shall dispute in our Lord's presence with one another." Page 275. So, there might be an opportunity to spar your way out of the flames, if this preceding verse is to be taken on face value. Allah wants to see dead Mohammed arguing with unbelievers; another sport I suppose which Allah enjoys. He does not just like to watch horror; a lot of horror, but he enjoys some more intellectual pursuits, as well. Since Mohammed is long dead, if he did end up in Paradise, Allah is watching and listening to unbelievers desperately arguing with Mohammed that there is something wrong with his theology. If they lose the argument, which they are bound to, Allah will enjoy watching unbelievers, '...who will receive a punishment, shameful and everlasting.' Page 276.
