Three unidentified objects in formation stacked up one directly above the other were sighted on 23 July 1952 at approximately 1250 hastern Deylight Time estimated at between 50,000 and 80,000 feet and reported by the observer as above the general area of Altoena, Pa. The objects did not a pear to mancuver out of this area. One pilot reported that the center object appeared to move outward on a herizontal plane to an estimated 30 feet from its position, remained there for a proximately 45 seconds, then returned to its point of origin. Objects were under serveillance for approximately 20 minutes. Their appearance was reported as cylin rical to rectangular. All were a proximately of the same size with an estimate of 80 root in cienceter. All objects were bright and reflected light as would notable or silver a winced ratorial.

- b. Objects were first sighted at 1250 Eastern Daylight Time (1650Z) and were under continuous observation for approximately 20 minutes.
- c. Observation was made by visual means from two F-94B aircraft at an indicated airspeed of 150 to 130 knots and altitudes of 35,000 feet up to 46,500 feet indicated.
- d. Location of observing aircraft was reported by the area controller as PK5040 and FK2058. Objects were estimated by the observers to be from 5,000 feet to 30,000 feet above the aircraft.
- The total flying experience, including cadet training, of the four observers is as fellows:

- f. Weather at the time of sightings was reported to be clear with the exception of a squall line which was in the vicinity of the sighted objects but in no way limited the nightings.
- g. It is believed by the observers that no activity or condition, meteorelegical or otherwise, can account for this sighting.
- h. No phatographs could be taken since it was impossible to elevate the nose of the aircraft high enough at 46,500 feet to get the objects in the camera sights.
 - i. The area controller was kent advised of the sightings by voice.
- j. Our aircraft report that there were other fighters and a bomber in the area of the sightings.
- 2. Statements by the four observers to be attached as incleanes have not been prepared since the above information has been prepared in cooperation with the persons making the observations.
